Editorial

THE FAMILY AND YOUNG

The family is the first educator, not only in a temporal sense, but also as a model of "how to educate". In the Apostolic Exhortation "The Joy of Love" Pope Francis presents in a clear and forceful way, the responsibility of parents to educate their children in a way that is aware, enthusiastic, and reasonable and appropriate (Cf. no.259). The indications offered are practical and doable by family that assumes deeply its duty. It is the place for support, accompaniment, and guidance for the children. The time parents spend with them, speaking with simplicity and affection of important things, can create useful reference points and help them to orient themselves in life, defending themselves even from external invasions. Education regards generating processes for the maturation of their freedom so that they can act with wisdom and foresight even in difficult situations, furnishing them with the means to make their decisions with good sense. There are good attitudes to inculcate even from a tender age so that they are appreciated and practiced. A patient realism leads us to ask proportionate sacrifices of children and gradually propose values that are accompanied by the good example of the adults. Freedom must be channeled and liberated, though always subject to a series of conditionings that, in some cases, makes its exercise difficult if not impossible (Cf.no.273).

Over the past decade, research has highlighted the importance of close and caring relationships between young people and their parents. Strong relationships were shown to be protective against a range of behaviours that affect health and wellbeing of children, including substance use, violence and early initiation of sexual behaviours. Since them, the importance of family connectedness in children has been a central component of research, program and service delivery in adolescent health. Adolescence is seen as a time when the relationship between parents and their children is under significant pressure. There are untold changes that young people and their families experience during the adolescent period, and ways that practioners can help facilitate or strengthen bonds between the two.

Due to the irresponsible parenthood often children come to the streets. The causes may be drunken parents, ill treatment meted out to them, physical, mental and sexual harassment by the family members, and inability to cope up with syllabus in the school, pressure from the parents and teachers.

At this juncture it is our bounden duty to take care of these children as in a family and bring them to the fore fronts at all levels. Here we thank all the institutions who take care of all these less fortunate children of our society.

In the house, the children had their camp, they learnt many useful things such making paper baskets, pen holders, different kinds of articles which are useful to them.




24 APRIL

Deepa has something to say: I am Deepa, staying at Auxilium Navajeevana Kammanahalli. I am studying the IInd PUC. I am 17 years old. I am brought up by Navajeevana Sisters. I would like to share my story and life experiences.

When I was small, we were together with my father, mother, elder brother and sister. Mother was sickly and father took to drinks. My mother was working as a maid servant and father as a mason at constructions. Whatever my father works and earns, he finishes off with drinks and comes home troubles mother and us. When I was in 3rd STD and just 9 years old I lost my mother. She had kidney failure and she died. The family for whom my mother was working took care of us and the aunty brought me and my sister to Navajeevana, Chamarajpet.

Uma my elder sister too joined in the school staying at Kammanahalli and completed her PUC. She passed with good marks. She was sent to Nirmaljyothi, a Technical School at Bannerghatta. She did one year course at Nirmaljyothi and at present working in an office earns a good salary. My brother too works as a mason. My father is away from the responsibility of looking after us and bringing us up. Even now he is addicted to alcohol and lies any where even near roadside. We have lost all hopes having him as a loving father.



As for me and for my sister, the Navajeevana has given us new life. They are, our father, mother, everything. We are educated, given a good formation, making us to stand on our own, all these because of our good sisters of Navajeevana. We are ever grateful to them. The values they have given us hold well for our life. May you are rewarded amply dear Sisters. Like me and my Sister many more may enjoy their goodness, care and love. We pray God to bless you all dear Sisters.




Camp at Visthar:


